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

DAY 4

WEISSENKIRCHEN

Cruise to Weissenkirchen, gateway to Dürnstein located in the heart of the Wachau Valley. Once here, you can choose to join a walking tour in Dürnstein along its cobblestone streets to the Baroque Stiftskirche, Dürnstein's famed church tower, and then visit Melk's magnificent Benedictine Abbey. For the more active adventurer, hike up to the fortress where Richard the Lionheart was once held. As an alternative excursion, visit a local apricot grower, where you'll enjoy the regions finest apricot treats. Later in the evening, enjoy a special wine tasting of locally grown, world-renowned Riesling and Grüner Veltliner in Weissenkirchen.

DAY 5

VIENNA

The "City of Waltzes" offers a treasure trove of gems and you have three ways to discover them. Join a city tour showcasing its regal splendors, including the majestic Opera House, St. Stephen's Cathedral and the former Imperial Palace of the Habsburgs before concluding in Vienna's historic city center, a UNESCO World Heritage site. For a more active exploration of the area, take a guided bike ride along the Danube. During the afternoon, you can enjoy leisure time or pedal your way to Klosterneuburg Monastery on a guided cycling tour.

DAY 6

BRATISLAVA, SLOVAKIA

Host to the crowning ceremonies of 11 Hungarian kings and queens between 1536 and 1830, Bratislava certainly has earned the title "Coronation City of Kings" as you'll discover during your walking tour. Or join a culinary host to sample traditional Slovakian specialties, as well as learn how to prepare stuffed potato ravioli with an opportunity to taste your own creation. For a more active adventure, hike up to Bratislava Castle, which offers magnificent views of the city.

DAY 7

BUDAPEST, HUNGARY

Experience Budapest in one of two ways: on a city tour or a hike. Your city tour begins with a visit to the vibrant Great


Market Hall brimming with vendors selling everything from food to souvenirs. The remainder of this tour takes you to both the Buda (hilly) and Pest (flat) sides of the river. As an alternative choice, hike up to Castle Hill for breathtaking views of the city below. Spend your last evening on board cruising around the famed Parliament Building as the city turns on all her dazzling lights.

Life after the Sound of Music

The city that was the home for the exterior scenes of the classic move The Sound of Music was also home to the real Von Trapp Family, immortalized on stage and silver screen.

Located on the northern boundary of the Alps along the serene Salzach River which meanders through the center of town, Salzburg is a feast of the senses. It's small enough in size that you can walk almost anywhere if you have a strong constitution and its winding medieval streets are full of surprising boutiques, galleries and cafes.

You'll find locals friendly if you take the time to say "hello" as you pass by. Be sure to sample a plate of schnitzel or some warmed gühlwein during the colder months. And don't miss the birthplace of Mozart. It's located right in the center of Old Town.

Because of its association with the Sound of Music and location near the Lakes District of Austria, Salzburg is often a day excursion on a Danube cruise or easily included as a pre- or post-cruise stay along with nearby Munich.

Peppered with baroque towers and watched over by an imposing hilltop fortress, Salzburg is so much more than just the Sound of Music locales (although if you don't hop from bench to bench in the fabled gazebo from the movie while whistling "Sixteen Going On Seventeen," you're really missing out). SOUND OF MUSIC

SHOPPING PICK

GETREIDEGASSE

Salzburg's Old City is a vibrant place teeming with one memorable encounter after another. It's a place where people live and work. Many traditional manufacturers are based on and along the Getreidegasse, including master bakers and furriers, liqueur producers and weavers, confectioners and tailors. They all play their own unique role in invigorating the narrow streets. Many of these traditional workshops, due to their long tradition, are tourism attractions in their own right, such as the 600-year-old Schlosserei Wieber metalworking shop in the Getreidegasse or Stiftsbäckerei St. Peter, a bakery that dates all the way back to the 12th century.





PERFECT ATTRACTION

HOHENSALZBURG CASTLE

You can't miss Hohensalzburg Castle, which looms over the city and is one of the best-preserved medieval fortresses in Europe. Located atop a mountain known as Festungsberg, it can be accessed either by a cobblestone path or a gondola system. Inside, you'll find architecture dating from the 1000s to the 1800s, amazingly preserved carvings and some impressive suits of armor.

MUSEUM DER MODERNE

The striking Museum der Moderne is a sleek glass and white building located atop a ridge running along the same mountain as Hohensalzburg Castle. The museum features a variety of striking artworks and always seems to have a fascinating exhibition running. For example, Photography 1970-2000, a presentation organized in collaboration with the Albertina in Vienna, is now running and later this year an excellent collection of Japanese photographs from between 1960 and 1970 will be on display. Perhaps the only thing more inspiring than the works of art is the panoramic view of Salzburg laid out at your feet.

Though thoroughly modern, an authentic steamboat of this size and grandeur likely will never be built again. Return to the world of Mark Twain and sail into yesteryear.



The largest and most opulent authentic paddlewheel steamboat ever built, the *American Queen* is nothing short of stunning. The attention to detail in the recreation of the décor, style and overall feel of a 19th-century riverboat is truly extraordinary. The rich mahogany woods of the Mark Twain gallery and its cozy seating are like a big Southern hug, the Grand Saloon where lectures and production shows take place is a dead ringer for a turn-of-the 20th century opera house in a small river town, and the J.M. White Dining Room's two deck windows and ornate fretwork are akin to a grand Victorian

ROYALTY ON THE RIVER

James Lida, CEO of Select Waterways, has a particular affinity for the *American Queen* since he worked for its first owner, Delta Queen Steamboat Company, and then later when the ship passed to the American Queen Steamboat Company, he helped launch the new brand as a consultant. Clearly, we have a lot of reasons to love the *American Queen*, but perhaps none is greater than the joy of sitting on deck in a rocking chair sipping a sweet tea or mint julep and watching that bright red paddlewheel churn its way from the present into the past.

Chocolate lovers everywhere, rejoice!

And set your sights on Vienna, that glittering city of kaffehaus culture and scrumptious cakes. The crème-de-la-crème of cake wizardry here is the iconic Sachertorte, available at the renowned Hotel Sacher. Rich dark chocolate, apricot jam and utter

deliciousness will send your taste buds spiraling into sensory overload. Always served with a side-dollop of schlag, aka whipped cream, this cake promises to indulge your most delightful champagne wishes and decadent dreams.

INGREDIENTS

- 4.5 oz. butter, softened
- 1/2 cup dark chocolate, melted
- 2 tbsp. sugar
- 7 egg yolks
- 7 egg whites, whipped
- 7 oz. flour
- 2 tbsp. apricot Jam

GANACHE

- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 cup dark chocolate
- 1 stick butter

PREPARATION METHOD

Mix butter, sugar, and egg yolks together until creamy. Fold the melted chocolate into the mixture. In a separate bowl, fold the whipped egg whites and flour together. Combine with the egg yolk and chocolate mixture. Pour into a greased 9" round cake pan. Bake for approximately 45 min. at 370 F°. Let the cake cool and remove from pan. When fully cooled, cut the cake in half horizontally. Fill with apricot jam and glaze top of cake with the ganache.

Makes 8 servings.

WINE

SCHLOSS GOBELSBURG WINERY


AUSLESE GRÜNER VELTLINER

On a wine-themed cruise along the Danube, this family-owned winery, the oldest in the region with origins in the 12th century, just might be one of your stops. Sweet wine is one of the estate's specialties. Because of the Danube region's dry continental climate, large quantities of grapes infected with noble rot (Botrytis) are a rare occurrence indeed. But when there is enough of the sweetening Botrytis, the vintners select the affected berries and bunches from the vineyards very carefully, and then separate the grapes in a second selection process for Auslese wines. If possible, spring for 2007 or 2012 vintages, which are truly exceptional, with aromas of sweet pea, mandarin, honey, and a hint of smoke-distilled pit fruits and sweet green herbs. Pineapple, caramelized peach and persistently juicy citrus inform a satisfyingly long finish.

TRAVEL BOOK PICK

SISI: EMPRESS ON HER OWN

Married to Emperor Franz Joseph, Elisabeth—fondly known as Sisi—captures the hearts of her people as their "fairy queen," but beneath that dazzling persona lives a far more complex figure. Featuring larger-than-life historic figures such as Bavaria's "Mad King Ludwig" and the tragic Crown Prince Rudolf, and set against many of Europe's grandest sites—from Germany's storied Neuschwanstein Castle to England's lush shires—Sisi brings to life an extraordinary woman and the romantic, volatile era over which she presided.

PHOTOGRAPHY TIP

THE RULE OF THIRDS

Ever wonder why a professional photographer's photos always look better than yours? The lighting, location and subject matter can be the same, but you still rank a distant second place. Here's one secret from the pros: The Rule of Thirds. Essentially, it means put the subject of our photo in the horizontal or vertical one-third area of the frame. An ocean shot with the horizon right across the middle is never as dramatic as if the horizon line is a third of the way from the top or bottom. When taking pictures of people, always put the faces in the top third of the photo. Suddenly professional photos are as easy as one, two, three!



FLYING TIP

HYDRATE, HYDRATE, HYDRATE

You've made it to the airport, boarded your plane and have settled in ready for your flight to begin your vacation. You feel relaxed, happy and want to celebrate, right? If you can, curb the urge to raise a glass of bubbly or clink your cosmo. Alcohol is a diuretic, meaning it takes water from your system.
